The grand-prize winners received a prize package valued at \$20,000, including \$10,000 cash from Information Services Corp. (ISC), \$5,000 in-kind package of information technology services and technical expertise from EDS, and \$2,500 worth of legal services with \$2,500 in matching value service from Furman & Kallio.
